### What is Feline Leukemia?

Feline leukemia is a cancerous disease caused by the feline leukemia virus (FeLv). FeLv causes diseases other then leukemia including immunodeficiency and additional cancers. Cats may not start to show signs of the disease for months or years after being infected with FeLv. Infection with FeLv is a major cause of illness and death in domestic cats.

### Feline Leukemia can cause:

- ▶ Immunodeficiency

It attacks and weakens the body's immune system, making the animal susceptible to infections and diseases that don't affect healthy cats. There is no cure for FIV. Though eventually fatal, an FIV-positive cat can live for many years without any signs of illness.






# <u>Fleas</u>


to occur. Repeated flea bites not only cause discomfort for your petsheavy infestations can lead to iron deficiency and even death in very young puppies and kittens.


